BEHAVIOR PLAN
2009-2010*

Step 1:

A staff member will address and review with the student why their misconduct was inappropriate, and recommend in their discussion a plan for correcting the student's inappropriate behavior. Student misconduct may be corrected by having the student repeat the action in an appropriate manner, or a consequence may be applied such as a time out, and/or loss of privilege, recess or restrictions of activities.

Step 2:

For repeated or more serious problems, the principal will talk with the student about previous attempts to correct the behavior and about the serious and/or repetitive nature of the misconduct. A consequence will be applied and a Behavior Report will be issued and sent home for parent signature. Consequences may include a time out, loss of privilege, recess, or restrictions in activities. The student will be responsible for writing a plan which identifies their specific misconduct, and sets positive corrective behavior goals for the future.

Step 3:

For continuing and repeated misconduct, harassment, bullying, third party bullying, exceptional misconduct, or for illegal or dangerous activities a Behavior Report will be issued, and the parent /guardian will be notified by the principal. Consequences may include restriction of activities, in-school suspension, out of school suspension, or expulsion.

***All Dutch Hill students will be

1. Students will behave in a manner safe for themselves and others.
2. Students will treat others with respect and courtesy.
3. Students will respect and care for school property and the property of others
4. Students will not physically or verbally hurt others.
5. Students will try their best at all times.

***Dutch Hill Student
Behavior Expectations:***

- Students must have a written note from a parent, or permission slip to be at school prior to 8:15 A.M. or after 3:10 P.M.
- Students are to stay within the fenced perimeter of the school campus.
- Toys, game balls, and or electronic devices are not permitted at school. Dutch Hill is not responsible for personal property if it is lost or stolen.
- Students are to stay off of the grassy hill.
- Students are to play safely at all times while using school equipment and play structures. Jumping from equipment, swings, tackling, rough physical contact, "take downs", "play fighting", and karate type movements are not permitted at school. Sticks, rocks, wood chips, etc., must stay on the ground.
- Students are to adhere to the recess game rules, play cooperatively, and be inclusive of all who wish to participate in group game activities.
- Students must have a pass in order to travel to the principal's office, main office, health room, library, and through the hallways.
- Students must use appropriate language at all times.
- Students must use conversational voices in the buildings, outside walkways, and on the bus.
- Appropriate assembly behavior and audience participation is expected from all students.
- Students will follow the Dutch Hill Elementary School Dress Code. (see school handbook)
- Wear hats at recess only.
- Gum is not permitted at school.

HARASSMENT/ANTI-BULLYING:

Dutch Hill Elementary School and the Snohomish School District is committed to a safe and civil educational environment for all students, employees, volunteers and patrons free from harassment, intimidation or bullying. Any physical, verbal, or written act of abuse, violence, threat, harassment, intimidation, vulgarity, profanity, derision, or hazing will not be tolerated. Such behavior will result in disciplinary action and may be grounds for immediate suspension or expulsion.
